## MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT MARCH APRIL 2024

Annual Club Meeting-Mark your calendar!!!! We asked you to do your best to try and make an effort to attend this year's meeting scheduled for Saturday, March 23rd, at 11 am at the Clubhouse.

Our annual meeting is an opportunity for our Board of Governors and its committees to report to the membership on all the Club's activities for the past year. It would be great to see some of our newest members attend. Meetings generally run for about an hour. This year, we only have our annual elections and committee reports, so the meeting should go quickly. We need a quorum (10%) of the total membership in good standing, currently about 50 members, to conduct Club business. And to be clear, if two members of the same household show up, it only counts as one Club member for quorum purposes. We will post the annual meeting packet on our webpage under members only. Official notices are being mailed. Light refreshments will be served after the meeting.

Our swim team committee begins its monthly meetings to prepare for its season, so please try to attend if you have a potential swimmer. Our social committee is preparing for all our Spring and Summer events and can always use new volunteers.

Invoices for Club dues will be going out shortly. It is important for ALL members, just not a few, to donate some of their time to the Club from time to time, especially on our workdays and with our committees, to help control our costs. Without volunteerism, our dues would be significantly higher if we had to pay for all the labor to complete many projects and events throughout the year. For example, we usually do a considerable leaf clean-up in the fall on all our properties, but due to a lack of volunteers, we are now paying \$2500.00 to have them cleaned up each year. I have been noticing a steady drop-off of volunteers on our work days. Getting involved is what builds a community.

While paying your dues this year, we ask our members to update their contact information with the Club. It would be helpful to include your current phone number and email address when returning your dues invoice, even if you have done so in the past. We always seem to have a few that bounce back in our email blast system. We would like to include our members in our email blast system for future notifications to keep everyone informed.

We have scheduled our Spring workday for Saturday, April 20th. As always, we need volunteers to help get the Club properties ready for the season. Please consider coming out for an hour or two to help out. We have a light breakfast at 8 am and head to the properties afterward. If you are unsure where to go or what you can do, stop at the Clubhouse first. We are generally done before noon and have lunch available. There will be a Signup Genius put out at the beginning of April.

As Spring starts to move in, we will begin to see more activity around the lake, such as walkers/runners and bikers out and around the lake. Just a reminder to be alert and please be aware of the posted speed limits throughout the lake to help ensure all our residents' safety. NJ passed a bicycle and pedestrian move-over law in 2021 that requires drivers to move over one lane when passing if it safe to do so, or allow four feet of space between the car and the person being passed. If that is not safe to do, it would require a driver to slow to 25 mph. We see many vehicles crossing way over the double yellow and, in many cases, on dangerous curves. If all simply do 25 mph while traveling the lake, which is the posted speed limit in most of the lake, there is no reason to cross over, and it will go a long way to keep all safe.





#### **Summary of the Lake Shawnee Club Board Meetings**

January 5, 2024

It was noted that there was no Board meeting held in December.

It was reported that the December Poker event had a good turnout. Upcoming events include Whiskey Tasting and the Winter Carnival. The Polar Plunge has been postponed but the event will include fire pits, s'mores, crafts, and hot cocoa. Fall Beer Tasting has been rescheduled to Sept. 21<sup>st</sup>.

The Lake is quiet at the moment although at least 20 geese have been observed recently due to the warmer weather this winter. We were lucky to have low numbers last summer; hopefully they will leave shortly.

The Board discussed treatment management proposals for the upcoming year.

A Budget Committee meeting will be scheduled to discussed the Budget for the upcoming year.

An ice fishing contest scheduled for January 20<sup>th</sup> that probably won't happen due to the warm temperatures and lack of ice. The backup date is scheduled for February 10<sup>th</sup>. Three otters have been observed on the lake as well as diving ducks.

The Swim Team went caroling on December 22nd. They made a Facebook plea to see who wanted them to stop by, and then caravaned to those houses. Upcoming events include a spaghetti dinner on March 9th as a fundraiser. The next parent meeting is scheduled for February 1<sup>st</sup>.

Toppers for the wall at the Clubhouse have been reported missing; one fell into the lake and one has been replaced. A hole in the wall has also been repaired and repainted. It was reported that the stairs at Second Beach had a loose tread that needs repair. The stairs will need to be replaced along with the wall at Second Beach as a future Capital Improvement project. The stair treads will be reglued again once weather permits. There was a report of a broken board on the boardwalk as well as the split rail which will be addressed during spring cleanup. Third Beach was hit pretty bad by recent storm. There was a gully by the boat ramp, the dock was moved, stones were washed into the sand, there was a lot of debris around the entire property and they lost some of the beach. A good spring clean-up will be needed. Ms. Lisa Peter cleaned the signs of graffiti on the signs at White's Cove, which were shown to Jefferson Township detectives who did not recognize the tags. The sluice gate has been causing issues opening and closing; Board members will investigate and repair.

A new committee has been formed and will meet later in the month to discuss and research a five-year Capital Improvement plan/projects.

The Board was updated on the Property Line Adjustments. Surveys have been completed and sent to the Club attorney. They will next be sent to the Land Use Board at Jefferson Township. There was a brief discussion about payments and reimbursements. There was also an update on the sale of the property at North End.

The Board discussed and approved the Master Calendar for 2024. It was approved that the meeting for July would be scheduled for June 28<sup>th</sup> due to the July 4th holiday.

There was a brief discussion regarding the Bike Parade and Kick Off to Summer July 4th.

#### **February 2, 2024**

The Social Committee reported on recent events including Whiskey Tasting with Mr. Matrisciano which had 9 people in attendance, and Poker on Sunday, January 28<sup>th</sup> in the afternoon (this new afternoon format was enjoyed and they are planning another in March). Upcoming events included an evening Poker event on February 10<sup>th</sup> and the Winter Carnival on Feb. 4th. There will be no Polar Plunge, but arts and crafts will be provided for kids, as well as fire pits, hot cocoa, fire pits, s'mores, mulled wine and a chili contest.

The Budget Committee met recently and discussed the upcoming yearly budget. The Board voted to accept the Budget as presented by the Committee.

An ice fishing contest is scheduled for next weekend, which will most likely be cancelled due to lack of ice.

A new network cabinet in the Club's office, and an old printer was removed and recycled. Rain and cold temperatures have prevented repairing the stairs at 2<sup>nd</sup> Beach. The sluice will be inspected with an endoscope to determine the cause of recent issues

It was reported that the Capital Planning Team met and identified eight different projects. They will research these projects to discuss at their next meeting in March.

Stewart Engineering will be contacting the NJDEP regarding the last set of plan revisions, as well as completing the annual visual inspection of the dam which is due by April 15<sup>th</sup>.

The Board was updated on the status of the Property Line Adjustments and the sale of the property at North End.

Wildlife - Remember the days when geese used to migrate. They would leave mid to end of November and wouldn't return until the end of March; by the mid of March, they would start to pair up to reproduce. Well, things have changed. At the end of January, we had 20 geese on our lake. This is very strange considering we only had a handful for most of the summer. Those only stuck around for a week or so then we had a cold wave where the lake froze. It looked as if winter had finally settled in. Shortly after that freeze, things warmed up and we were back to open water and a handful of geese were back. The most unusual sight was in Beaver Cove, where we had a few patches of ice from some cold nights and I saw several geese sitting on the ice. I have been here for 45 years and this I have never witnessed before. I believe this is a result of climate change and migrating waterfowl reacting to temperature. Geese are terrestrial feeders who love short, well-maintained grass. Warmer temperature and lack of snow means there is still a reliable source of food. I know this sounds ridiculous with the 8 inches of snow we received just before this writing, but until this snowfall and that cold spell we have had a mild winter.

Geese's migration distance has become shorter and shorter over the years and now some hang around most of the winter. What does this mean to us? They will be pairing up much earlier (several in the cove look like they have already started), so we will have a very active addling season this spring. I have explained this process before but just an FYI to new residents in the lake. We try to identify nests with a sitting female and a male lurking close by. We approach the nests and gently encourage the female to leave temporarily and then we take each egg and shake it vigorously for about 15 seconds. This disrupts the gosling's development so it will not hatch. Some may not agree with this method, but you must realize that where a gosling is hatched, it becomes a lifelong resident. They will come back every year and reproduce in Lake Shawnee. They often lay 4 -6 eggs a year, so we could have a lot of geese on this lake in years to come. The town of Jefferson obtains the permit from the State to allow us to do this. The main reason is their droppings end up on our grass areas and on our beaches and docks, and eventually with a rain, they end up in our lake. Several summers we have had to close beaches from the bacteria in the water from their droppings. Over the years, we have tried just about everything to discourage their numbers on our lake. From scarecrows to spraying a material on the grass that has a foul taste so geese will not eat it, to shooting firecrackers out of a shotgun to scare them, but nothing has worked, until we started to addle. It takes at least two to do the addling, one to hold the male and female at bay and the other to do the shaking. So, we are always looking for volunteers to help. If you see a sitting female, please give me call so I can go and check it out.

In addition to our geese being here early, we also had 6 swans on the lake the beginning of February. I say HAD six because we lost 2. One was found dead stuck between the two culverts that drain the wetland into Beaver Cove near Stanlick School. How it wound up there I am not sure. The other dead swan was found in the cove by Wayne and Pam Kulick's house off East Shawnee Trail. Wayne observed two other swans fighting with it. We are not sure if this is how he died. Swans do become very territorial. Thank you, Wayne for getting the deceased swan out of the water.

That's it for now. Just a reminder, since our next article will not be out until Spring and many of you will have started treating your lawns by then (I feel very weird telling you this with eight inches of snow on the ground) but please remember to use a fertilizer with no phosphorus (most fertilizers have no phosphorus). It fosters weed growth in the lake and no matter where you live, all our catch basins drain into the lake so there is a very good chance whatever you put on your lawn, the rain can carry it into the lake.

#### **Ice Safety**

Outdoor ice sports and activities can be safe and enjoyable, but there is no such thing as 100 percent safe ice. Anyone who spends time near the ice should first determine the ice conditions, and then take precautions to stay safe.

#### **Preventing Ice Accidents**

- Follow these guidelines to avoid accidents when on or near ice:
- Check the ice thickness before going out. To be safe, ice should be solid and at least 4 inches
  thick. Remember, the ice may not be the same thickness over the entire area of a lake or pond.
  Test ice thickness by using a chisel, cordless drill or ice auger.
- Be safe—the more people on the ice, the thicker it should be.
- Use ice on smaller, shallower and slower-moving bodies of water for ice activities, it is usually more solid.
- Look for objects sticking up through the ice and mark them as hazards.
- Do not go out on ice that has recently frozen, thawed and then frozen again. This happens
  in the spring and early winter as temperatures change often. Wait until the outside temperature
  has been below freezing long enough that at least 4 inches of solid ice forms over the entire
  area.
- Always stay with at least one other person.
