First, we have to THANK this amazing community!!! OH,

MY GOODNESS, our committee is absolutely floored by the generous fishing badge donations! During July's board meeting, it was reported that \$2,900 was collected, which will be put towards the 2026 Bass stocking!

Our summer fishing season is coming to an end. It is sad, but looking back we enjoyed great weather days with an average twelve bass caught per tourney.



Back in June, 17 anglers (including 4 juniors) watched Todd Lipchus annihilate the competition with a total of 85.75". Our fly guy, Mike Faber, came in second w/57.25" and Big Bass (21"). Mike paid it forward donating \$100 of his winnings towards next year's stocking. Logan Zimmer squeezed out the Big Pickerel (20") in the last 5 mins. 15 healthy bass were caught on a hot sunny day!

On July 19, our scheduled evening event was well attended, 22 participants. We had hoped to catch more fish, but despite the funky weather decent-sized fish were reported in. Marcia Farber topped out the evening with a total of 54.75" including the Big Bass (20"). Newcomer Jerry O'Conner tipped his lines for a second-place finish with 52.50" total. Logan Zimmer, who is becoming the new fish whisperer, landed Big Pickerel (19") for a second tournament in a row.



August 16th, an absolutely gorgeous day, the junior clinic was held from 11-3 which included a BBQ as awards were handed out. 12 young anglers joined Fish & Game officer A. Sutton, Casey Cumberton, Logan Zimmer and of course their very supportive and attentive parents (Chrissy, Kevin & Andy). Also, a big thanks to fishing committee members Vern, Marcia, Lynda and Tom for their part in making it another successful event. August adult tourney has not been held previous to this report. Results will be posted in next newsletter; until then, Facebook will post winners.

As the summer days went by, we caught, watched and heard some really Big Bass being caught out there. In fact, as I write this, Logan Zimmer just caught 4.5 pounder from the docks! September is an amazing time of the year and that goes for fishing too! Chrissy Cumberton for helping organize some of the needed clerical work; she got us fully digital for keeping track of the days' catches and stats! Also, for helping set up AND for breeding the worms in her worm farm! Tom Preston, once again, for donating his time to help out and honestly for being so patient with the kids! Tom grew up in LS, but no longer lives here, however he is still highly involved and donates his time to many of the events run by the Club. Also, a giant thanks to New Jersey Fish & Wildlife Conservation Officer Allen Sutten for donating his time and spending the entire day interacting with the kids and for the giveaways they provided to the

kids. Not only did the kids get excited to see a real Wildlife Officer and Police truck, but random LS residents also came by and thanked him for participating, including Lake Shawnee's President and Jefferson Mayor Eric Wilsusen. The Deputy Chief of NJ Fish & Wildlife is former colleague of mine and now a personal friend; he told me the officers love to visit Lake Shawnee and are impressed with how nice our private community is and how well it is run. They have again invited themselves back for next year! Finally, to the parents that encouraged the kids and those that participated as needed.

This event was run solely on volunteered time and just about everything needed to run the event was donated. The event was completely free to the children and IMO was again a success!



Now to the results (Go ahead, make the drumroll sound)

Total participants: 13 registered, 7 were new to the event this year. Ages 6 to 13 were represented. At least 6

others could not attend due to youth sporting events today.

Bait used: 2 dozen packs (12-15 per pack) of live worms were used!

Total fish caught (recorded): 51. Some fish were released before they were recorded, and some were caught outside of the 'official' fishing zone. So, the actual total is a bit higher than the official recorded number. All fish were safely released back into Lake Shawnee.

Most Fish caught (total): Harrison Ward (10 fish), Nicholas Wilson (8 fish), Anthony Fischetti (5 fish)

Largest fish of the day: 9.25" - Joe (JoJo) Chismar, Nicholas Wilson 9", Garrett Zimmer 7.5"



Smallest fish of the day: 3" - Paige Fedo & Anthony Fischetti (Tie)

Superstar Volunteer: Alayna Chismar, she was not registered and did not fish. She just was at the beach to swim but she came

over and just started to help without hesitation. She handled the fish with such grace and was very patient. Sportsmanship Award: Harrison Ward. This award was given to the participant who displayed the most character. Harrison was respectful towards wildlife and the safe release of the fish, as well as to the Conservation Officer and fishing committee members during casual conversation. Several times he was seen clearing brush to make room for the other anglers to compete along his side, as well as

cleaning up random trash. He untangled a few anglers' snags, and when the group was asked what the criteria for this award should be in their opinions, Harrison (unknowingly had already won) had the best answers that were in-line with the committees to win this award. Congratulations to Harrison!

Thanks again for all who came out to support this event, the donations received and for the parents who helped out...great event and we are looking forward to next years!!!

Summary of the Lake Shawnee Club Board Meeting July 11, 2025

It was reported that Planet Network was installed to provide internet service at the Clubhouse, First Beach and the Snack Shack.

The Social Committee reported on events held in June - Wine Tasting on the 7th, Full Moon Celebration on the 11th, and Trivia Night on the 21st. In July, they held the 4th of July Bike Parade and Kick off to Summer. It was a beautiful day and a great turnout! The Seniors raised \$142.05 from their bake sale to donate to the LSC Scholarship Fund. LSC merchandise and several ducks for the End of Summer Celebration were both sold. The Rock Snake was started and several votes were received for the name and distance achieved by the End of Summer Celebration. The first Ice Cream Social was cancelled on the 8th, due to the weather. Coming up in July are the following events: Biathlon/Color War/Movie Night – 18th, Ice Cream Social – 22nd, and Storytime – 29th.

There was a brief discussion on Summer Night Security. It was decided to skip this season due to lack of volunteers, but to consider coverage on weekends and holidays in the future.

Life guards are doing well this season and are offering swim lessons once again.

The Fishing Committee reported that the lake has had two fishing contests so far this Summer. The bass are healthy and averaging 9-11". There were 10 anglers for the first contest and 17 for the second (4 kids and 7 fly fishermen). Donations were made towards stocking the lake for next year. The next contest is 7/19 - 4-9pm, which will finish at the Clubhouse. There will also be a children's contest on 8/16. It was reported that \$2900 came in for the Fishing Committee from member donations and fishing badges.

The Swim Team kicked off their season on June 25th versus Cranberry Lake. The team lost, but gave a great effort. They continued with a win on June 28th versus Park Lakes, a win on June 30th versus Shore Hills, a loss on July 2nd vs. Saffin Pond and a loss on July 9th versus Shongum. The team held a car wash on June 29th that was very successful. The Ribbon Meet was held on July 7th where the team hosted 6 teams and several alumni were in attendance. The team held a water polo night on 7/10 instead of practice. Upcoming events include meets on July 12th versus Roxbury and the last home meet on July 16th versus Randolph. The team will be going to the Miners baseball game on July 19th and participating in a lake swim on July 23rd. The last team meet will be on July 22nd versus Mount Olive. Silvers will take place on July 26th and the End of Season banquet will be held on July 27th at Picatinny Arsenal.

Projects completed on Club properties included the following: urinal in the men's bathroom at the Clubhouse repaired, new locks installed on the outside bathroom (the code is still the same), new picnic tables were added and the old ones were discarded at First Beach (Thank you to the Zimmer family for assisting with the waterproofing), weed treatment was completed at 2nd Beach, the dock was installed at Whites Cove (the height and angle will be readjusted in the near future.)

There was a brief discussion on Sailing at 3rd Beach which was included in a recent edition of the Lake Hopatcong News magazine. Thanks to Mr. Tom Preston for all of his efforts; it is very nice to see all of the sailboats out on the lake.

There was a brief discussion on the new dock at North End; the Board determined that this dock is not meant for kayaks.

There was a brief discussion on the beach rule concerning children at the Beach - Children under 12 need to be supervised by a parent or an individual of at least 14 years old. It was determined that if a child under 12 is unattended, the parents should be notified to pick them up.

The Board is obtaining estimates for surveyors to complete the study for the reserves as required by new State legislation, as well as estimates for paving the Clubhouse parking area.

The Board approved to have the Clubhouse, deck, patio area, cement walkway, ramp, seawall and windows power washed for \$800.

The Board approved at purchase and installation of a gas generator for the Clubhouse; quotes will be obtained for the project.

Sue Bedel/Catherine O'Regan donated \$1,000 for the lifeguards.

Summary of the Lake Shawnee Club Board Meeting August 1, 2025

Planet Network has finished all of their installations, which provides the Clubhouse with free phone and internet indefinitely and the Snack Shack, as well; Optimum service was cancelled. Service for the Clubhouse television will need to be determined possibly a Firestick.

Mr. Wilsusen offered an update regarding the cape sealing/micro paving. Most of the lines have been removed along Hurdtown Trail, East Shawnee Trail, Fawn Terrace, Island Trail, Deer Trail Point and Beaver Point Trail, leading up to West Lakeview Trail. Notices will be sent out with any changes and/or updates.

Regular memberships are up by 16 households and Senior memberships are up by 20 households this year.

It was reported that homes for sale within the lake are on the market longer now and price reductions are occurring.

We will be hosting a Learn About the Lake Day on September 14th. The time is TBD.



THIS IS GREAT FOR RECREATION AT OUR BEAUTIFUL LAKE WITH MANY SUNNY DAYS & WARM TEM-PERATURES, BUT NOT SO GREAT FOR CONTROLLING WEED GROWTH. ON OUR LAST SURVEY WITH THE AIRBOAT, THE LAKE WAS 80 DEGREES AND A FOOT DOWN ON DEPTH. THERE IS VERY LITTLE WATER COMING IN & NO WATER GOING OVER THE SPILLWAY. IT'S LIKE A POT ON A STOVE, OUR LAKE IS "COOKING". IN SPITE OF A PERFECT ENVIRONMENT FOR WEED & ALGAE GROWTH, JULY HAD MINIMAL WEEDS & ALGAE. WE TREATED ONLY 1 ACRE FOR FILAMENTOUS ALGAE AT THE END OF JULY & SURPRISINGLY OUR CHEMISTRY FOR THE LAKE WAS VERY GOOD. THE D.O (DISSOLVED OXYGEN) WAS 9, CLARITY WAS 5 FEET, PH WAS 7.5 — ALL GREAT NUMBERS FOR A HEALTHY LAKE. UNFORTUNATELY, THE TEMPERATURE WAS 84 DEGREES WHICH IS NOT GOOD. BUT SINCE THE FIRST 2 WEEKS OF AUGUST, THINGS HAVE CHANGED. OUR BIOLOGIST FROM TIGRIS (JEFF HORN) TELLS ME THAT THIS IS HAPPENING AT MANY OF THE LAKES THAT THEY SERVICE. 2 WEEKS LATER, WE HAD 2 ACRES OF ALGAE, 1 ACRE OF MILFOIL & ABOUT 30 ACRES OF TAPE GRASS. WE TREATED FOR THE ALGAE & MILFOIL & ABOUT HALF OF THE TAPE GRASS. WHY ONLY HALF? WHEN AN HERBICIDE KILLS A PLANT, IT USES OXYGEN TO BIODE-GRADE. BUT THAT OXYGEN IS WHAT FISH NEED TO SURVIVE, SO TAKING OUT TOO MANY WEEDS CAN RESULT IN A SIGNIFICANT & UNWANTED "FISH KILL". ALSO, TAPE GRASS PRODUC-ES OXYGEN DURING PHOTOSYNTHESIS THAT FISH NEED, SO IT'S IMPERATIVE THAT WE PRO-TECT OUR FISH POPULATION. JEFF HORN WILL RETURN ON AUGUST 26th TO TREAT THE RE-MAINING EEL GRASS, WHICH WILL GIVE OUR LAKE TIME TO RECOVER THE "D.O".

WATER FOWL — THE GEESE POPULATION HAS BEEN A MYSTERY THIS SUMMER. AT THE END OF JUNE, WE ADDLED 4 EGGS AT NORTH END. WE MISSED ANOTHER NEST THAT SUCCESSFULLY HATCHED 4 GOSLINGS WHICH I INITIALLY SPOTTED BUT THEN NEVER SAW THEM AGAIN THIS SUMMER. IN MY MANY SURVEYS ON THE LAKE, I RARELY SEE ANY GEESE. APPARENTLY, THEY COME EARLY MORNINGS & EVENINGS & EAT THE GRASS AT FIRST BEACH. THEIR DROPPINGS HAVE BEEN MINIMAL AT THE BEACH. MANY LIFEGUARDS AT FIRST BEACH REPORTED SEEING OVER 20 GEESE ON THE GRASS AT FIRST BEACH IN JULY. BUT IN THE LAST FEW WEEKS, THEY HAVE SEEN VERY FEW (my thanks to the guards). PERHAPS THEY HAVE RETURNED TO THE CANALS OF LAKE HOPATCONG.

ALSO, WHERE ARE OUR SWANS? THEY HATCHED 4 SIGNETS IN JUNE, BUT HAVE NOT BEEN SPOTTED IN OUR LAKE. MAYBE ONCE THEY WERE ABLE TO FLY, THEY FOUND A BETTER PLACE TO LIVE?

WE HAVE OVER 30 DUCKS AND THEY SPEND MOST OF THEIR TIME IN WATER AND EAT AQUATIC VEGETATION. USUALLY NEWLY-HATCHED DUCKLINGS ARE CONSUMED BY SNAPPING TURTLES, BUT THIS SUMMER MANY HAVE SURVIVED.

Lake Shawnee Boat Usage and Storage Policy

- 1. Boats are defined as any vessel including but not limited to any row boat, patio/deck boat, sailboat, canoe, paddle boat, kayak, paddle board or other watercraft.
- 2. All boats utilized on the lake or stored on any Club property are required to obtain a Club issued boat decal. Boat decals are valid through April 1st following a Presidential election year. The decal shall be valid for a period that does not exceed 4 years.
 - a. All Boat decals shall be affixed outside the vessel closest to the bow on either the port or starboard side.
 - b. Boats & watercraft cannot exceed 25 feet in length and cannot be capable of exceeding 15mph.
 - c. Motorized boats must be electric powered only.
 - d. Member Guests launching boats on the lake shall have a guest badge in possession and present upon request.
 - e. Any boat & trailer launched into the lake must be clean and free of weeds.

3. Boats stored on Club Property:

- a. Any member wishing to store a boat on Club property shall complete a boat storage permit at the Club Office. Storage permits will be issued on a first come first serve basis; assigned by property stored and valid for the requested property only. Before moving a boat to another club property, members must first obtain a new boat permit at the club office, if one is available for the new property. The old permit will then become invalid. If permits are not available for the desired property, the boat may not be moved. There is no additional charge for a boat storage permit. The Board may limit the number of boat storage permits available to a single household to ensure availability to the overall club membership. Limits will be posted in the Club Office. The Board may also rescind any permits that are unused by July 1st of any year in which the permit is valid, and re-allocate to a member in need of a permit.
- b. Boats stored on Club property are to be stored on designated boat racks and in designated areas only. Boats stored outside the designated racks (e.g. on the ground) will be subject to removal from the property.
- d. Boat owners storing boats on Club property are responsible to remove any water from boats within 48 hours of any rain event.
- e. Sailboats may be moored not more than 25 feet off club property at White's Cove and Third Beach within designated areas.
- f. Excluding sailboats, no boats are to be stored or left in the water off club property for more than 24 hours.
- g. At White's Cove only and with permission of the Club, handicapped members as determined through a State Handicap Parking Permit, may leave their boat in water and/or request a closer/lower storage rack location. Provision 3c still applies.

4. Policy Compliance.

- a. Failure to comply with any section of this policy can result in loss of Club privileges as determined by the
- B. All Boats utilized on the lake are required to comply with existing NJ State laws and regulations regarding boats and vessels.
