MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT MAY/JUNE 2025

Happy Spring!

Thank you to everyone who attended our annual Club meeting. We had more than a quorum without making any phone calls, which hardly ever happens, and the meeting lasted a little over an hour, not my record but still not bad! It was great to see everyone. Our Board members gave their reports; we had no real business except our elections; thank you to our Board and volunteers for all their work for our Club and its members.

In May, we look forward to the official opening of our beaches with guards on duty starting Memorial Day weekend. Our guards will then be on duty each weekend until the end of June, after school ends, they will be on duty seven days a week through Labor Day, primarily at First Beach. As I do each season, I must remind all our beachgoers that our lifeguards are not beach babysitters. Parents or guardians are always responsible for watching their children around the water, especially the younger ones. Children under 12 must be accompanied by someone 14 or older. The outdoor bathroom at the clubhouse is available for use. The lock code can be found on the members-only page of our website, or you can ask our summer security or lifeguards. Please be kind to our outside bathroom.

We always need more lifeguards. Last year, we had a shortage, and some days, we could not cover some shifts. It is an excellent job for our local youth, so if you are 16 or older, please consider completing an application. Starting pay is now \$17.00 to be competitive with other beaches, and we pay for certifications and hold the training at our facility. So far, we intend to offer kids' swim lessons this year; information will be posted on our website and social media shortly for water testing dates, beginning sometime after July 4th.

If you plan on using the Club facilities, please bring your dues current and utilize your 2025 badges and/or wristbands when on Club property. Badges can be picked up outside the office during regular office hours for those who have sent in your payment. The office gets a little crazy this time of year.

This time of year, is probably a good time to review our beach & Club rules on our website and members -only page. We regularly hear members complain that many non-members use our properties, so utilizing your badges lets us know who belongs on our properties. Wristbands are available on request for members only; they are not to be used for guests.

Shawnee is a great place to walk or run, and as spring moves forward, more and more of our residents will take to our streets for exercise. As a courtesy to our residents, please drive carefully. Observe the "Move over, Pass Safely" law. It is recommended that walkers/runners walk opposite traffic, single file, please, for the walking groups, and cyclists must ride with traffic. Some reflective clothing is also recommended for those who like walking at dusk or dawn.

As mentioned at the annual meeting, volunteerism helps keep our costs down, so please consider helping out, especially on workdays. Since this is a May/June issue, I would also like to thank everyone who came out for our annual workday on April 26th.

There are a lot of great events coming up. Attending our many Club events helps with building a better community by getting to know your neighbors.



Spring Reminder- As the days get longer and temperatures rise, we start to turn our attention to those spring activities which include getting lawns healthier and removing the salt and grit from our cars once the hose is turned on. We have many new residents in Lake Shawnee, so much of this "Ask Jeff" is directed to them since I say this every year at this time. Please indulge me as I give new members tips on helping to keep Lake Shawnee as clean as we possibly can. Thank you! What we do in our yards and in our driveways can affect the health of this lake. Why? Because every catch basin (no matter where you live in our community) drains into our lake. Material from your yard or driveway with the help of a heavy rain can wind up in the road and into a nearby catch basin. We just have to be vigilant on how we do things on our properties. Living in a lake community has certain responsibilities that we all have to be aware of. I thank you all in advance for doing the right thing to protect our beautiful lake.

<u>Lawns</u> - If there are remaining leaves on your lawn, please bag them and put them out on Wednesday for pickup or take to the town which has a compost pile. Please do not blow them into the street . If you have a landscaper who takes care of your lawn, make sure they know what to do. Most companies blow them into their trucks and take them with them. When leaves get into our lake, they decompose and eventually become sediment and our lake gets shallower. Thank you!

<u>Fertilizers</u> - Many residents use fertilizers to make the lawns greener and healthier. All I ask is that you make sure there is no phosphorus in the product you are using. Most companies have eliminated that material but some still have it in there. Phosphorus can add to weed growth in our lake which is not good. If you are not sure what to use, ask Eric at our local True Value hardware store for help.

<u>Car Washing</u> - Biggest tip here, go to a car wash! The chance of washing your car in your driveway and it getting into a catch basin is very likely. Many would say it's a small amount but remember we have 540 homes in this lake. Even if 25 percent of those homes wash their cars, it can result in five to six hundred gallons of filthy, soapy water getting into our lake. Like many of your children, I swim in this lake every day during the summer so we all want the cleanest water possible.

Thank you for letting me share these few small things to help protect our lake. Remember it takes a village and our community does a great job of being aware and doing the right thing.

<u>Monarch Butterflies</u>- I recently read that Monarch Butterflies were placed on the Threatened Species list because their numbers have dropped dramatically. This is due to loss of habitat and climate change. Besides their beauty, they are prolific pollinators for many plants.

Monarchs go through four life cycles (egg, caterpillar, cocoon, and eventually a beautiful orange and black butterfly) several times a year. They are found all over the country and into Canada, but are most abundant east of the Rockies especially in NJ with the many plants we grow here. In the fall, they migrate to an area in Mexico for the winter. Excessive logging in that area has reduced this winter habitat. Also, because of climate change and warmer weather in the Fall, they get tricked and leave too late and succumb to the cold on their trip south. In the Spring, they return to lay their eggs on the leaves of a specific plant called milkweed, which many of us are familiar with. Unfortunately there is much less milkweed in NJ the past few years, which has also led to the monarch's decline. Here is where we help.

Please check your property to see if you have it growing there already (not sure what it looks like, just Google it). The seeds are in large pods on the plant. Many have at least 100 seeds or more in the pod. If you have seeds, please announce it on the Lake Shawnee Facebook page so you can share them with your neighbors. Farmstead Golf Course has about 100 plants on their lake course. I always grab at least 10 pods when I play. I always share the pods (Contact me if you are interested) so others can help save this amazing butterfly. So, please look for those plants at home or on your travels. Any way we can help the monarch numbers increase would be great. Thank you!

Summary of the Lake Shawnee Club Board Meetings

February 7, 2025

The Social Committee held a successful Winter Carnival, which included ice skating, firepits with smores, kids' activities/crafts, and a chili contest with 9 entries. Upcoming social events include Texas Hold 'em on Sat., Feb. 8th, a Full Moon Celebration on Wed., Feb. 12th and a Latin Dance Party on Friday, Feb. 14th. Planning has begun for the annual Easter Egg Hunt and Bunny Brunch in April. Due to the large turnout last year, they are working will require RSVPs and wristbands will be provided.

Mr. Keith reported that he will be installing a temporary net to keep geese from coming into the lake under Route 15; he will update the membership in his next Ask Jeff article.

The Board discussed the ongoing lot line adjustments and issues that have arisen with several parties involved.

March 7, 2025

It was noted that the Club recently collected \$7500 in lien revenue and membership is at 508 members out of a possible 542.

Poker was held on Feb. 8th and will be held again on March 16th and April 19th. The Full Moon Celebration was held on Feb. 12th and will be held again on March 14th and April 12th. A Latin Dance Night was held on Feb. 14th with 4 couples in attendance: another event will be held in the future. Plans are underway for the Annual Easter Egg Hunt and Bunny Brunch. Upcoming events include a Kid's Cooking class on April 14th, and a Kids' Painting Class on April 18th.

It was reported that a survey of the lake has been scheduled with Tigris for the beginning of April, and the Board was updated on the projected hydro raking project. It was reported that a representative from NJ Fish and Game will be assisting in addling eggs this year; a permit has been filed with the Township.

There was an Ice Fishing contest in January with 4 1/2 inches ice; all winners were nonmembers, and they were lucky to have another contest in February with 9 ½ inches of ice. NJ Fish and Game was out during the contests and all fishermen were very cooperative.

The Swim Team Board met recently and also held the first parent meeting of the season. Registration will be held on Friday, April 25th; registration fees were increased to \$85 per swimmer, as well as sponsorship fee (to \$75). They have a car wash scheduled for June 14th at the JTFD on Route 15.

One of the legs on the new dock at White's Cove snapped off, which may be covered under warranty. The dock will be removed and repaired.

The Board discussed the upcoming Annual Meeting on Sat. March 22nd (11am).

There was a brief discussion on the current rental agreement that prohibits wedding receptions. It was noted that weddings are allowed, but not receptions; the rental agreements will be updated.

There was another brief discussion on the rental agreement regarding the hold harmless clause, which is the standard for rental agreements. No changes will be needed.

The Board discussed and voted to approve the proposed budget for the 2025-2026 season, which included an additional \$10 increase of dues to cover the new regulations requiring Lake associations to have an assessment on Club properties and to create reserves to cover the cost of losses on the properties. Dues will increase from \$505 to \$530 for regular members and \$395 for Senior members.

April 4th

The Easter Egg Hunt and Bunny Brunch will be held on April 13^{th} at 12:30pm. They will be filling eggs on April 10^{th} . Other upcoming events are April 12^{th} – Full Moon Celebration, April 14^{th} – Kid's Cooking Class, April 18^{th} – Kid's Painting ClassApril 19 – Texas Hold'em

Mr. Keith updated the Board on the progress of the hydroraking project as well as his project to install a $32' \times 32'$ net to deter geese from entering the lake; there is currently one nest at North End.

The Board will submit all projects for the upcoming spring Work Day on April 26th. All projects will be added to a SignUp genius and sent to the membership; a light breakfast will be provided.

The process of hiring lifeguards for the upcoming year has begun; swim lessons will be a mandatory requirement for employment this year.

The start of the fishing season is Saturday, April 12th, with the first fishing contest.

The Swim Team registration is on April $25^{th} - 6-8pm - at$ the Clubhouse, and the team car wash is June 14^{th} . The team is currently looking for a junior assistant coach.

Mr. David Downs donated 2 flags for the inside of the Clubhouse – one American and one NJ. He is also donating a flag and pole for outside, which needs to be installed.



Sailing News

The sailing program will be returning to Lake Shawnee for the summer of 2025 with FREE sailing instructions and FREE "Sailing Camp." These opportunities are being offered to all interested members and invited guests — for adults and kids.

No prior sailing experience is required. So, if you have ever thought about trying it, come on out. Lake Shawnee is a great place to learn to sail. In the past, Lake Shawnee had an active adult sailing fleet and a large junior sailing program, which introduced hundreds of children to sailing and sailboat racing. For the last two summers, we have been introducing new sailors to the sport, as well as helping sailors with previous experience get back on a boat.

We plan to meet for sailing on Sundays at Third Beach starting on June 29th. If you have a sailboat, please bring it. But if you don't, no problem. We have a small fleet of sailboats available.

Safety while sailing will be first priority (followed closely by having fun!). New sailors who plan to sail solo on loaned boats (and anyone who wants to learn the basic 'nuts and bolts' of sailing) will be expected to attend a pre-season classroom instruction session:

- 1) Thursday, June 26th from 6:30 pm to 9:00 pm at the clubhouse; or,
- 2) Saturday, June 28th from 1:00 pm to 3:30 pm at Second Beach (outside).

These sessions will provide each new sailor with an introductory foundation of sailboat terminology, seamanship skills, and safe sailboat handling concepts which will prepare them for continuing instruction on Sundays at Third Beach and safe boat operation on the lake.

Last year, eight youth sailors and a handful of youthful adult sailors took part in our first "Sailing Camp." This year's week of daily sailing instruction and sailing will be held the week of June 23rd through June 27th (Monday through Friday), from 12:30 pm to 4:30 pm at Third Beach each day. Lake Shawnee Boat Usage and Storage Policy

- 1. Boats are defined as any vessel including but not limited to any row boat, patio/deck boat, sailboat, canoe, paddle boat, kayak, paddle board or other watercraft.
- 2. All boats utilized on the lake or stored on any Club property are required to obtain a Club issued boat decal. Boat decals are valid through April 1st following a Presidential election year. The decal shall be valid for a period that does not exceed 4 years.
 - a. All Boat decals shall be affixed outside the vessel closest to the bow on either the port or starboard side.
 - b. Boats & watercraft cannot exceed 25 feet in length and cannot be capable of exceeding 15mph.
 - c. Motorized boats must be electric powered only.
 - d. Member Guests launching boats on the lake shall have a guest badge in possession and present upon request.
 - e. Any boat & trailer launched into the lake must be clean and free of weeds.
- 3. Boats stored on Club Property:
 - a. Any member wishing to store a boat on Club property shall complete a boat storage permit at the Club Office. Storage permits will be issued on a first come first serve basis; assigned by property stored and valid for the requested property only. Before moving a boat to another club property, members must first obtain a new boat permit at the club office, if one is available for the new property. The old permit will then become invalid. If permits are not available for the desired property, the boat may not be moved. There is no additional charge for a boat storage permit. The Board may limit the number of boat storage permits available to a single household to ensure availability to the overall club membership. Limits will be posted in the Club Office. The Board may also rescind any permits that are unused by July 1st of any year in which the permit is valid, and re-allocate to a member in need of a permit.
 - b. Boats stored on Club property are to be stored on designated boat racks and in designated areas only. Boats stored outside the designated racks (e.g. on the ground) will be subject to removal from the property.
 - d. Boat owners storing boats on Club property are responsible to remove any water from boats within 48 hours of any rain event.
 - e. Sailboats may be moored not more than 25 feet off club property at White's Cove and Third Beach within designated areas.
 - f. Excluding sailboats, no boats are to be stored or left in the water off club property for more than 24 hours.
 - g. At White's Cove only and with permission of the Club, handicapped members as determined through a State Handicap Parking Permit, may leave their boat in water and/or request a closer/lower storage rack location. Provision 3c still applies.
- 4. Policy Compliance.
 - a. Failure to comply with any section of this policy can result in loss of Club privileges as determined by the board.
 - B. All Boats utilized on the lake are required to comply with existing NJ State laws and regulations regarding boats and vessels.

Lake Shawnee Club Policy Policy for use of Club Properties for Parties/Events

- 1) Beginning the first Friday of Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day, any member utilizing Club properties for any private party/event on weekends or holidays where non-member guests will exceed 7 or more guests, the hosting member is required to notify the Club office at least one week prior to the party/event to detail the type of party/event to be held which can be subject to Club approval.
 - All approved private parties/events will be issued a permit for the day. Failure to obtain a permit in a timely manner will result in denial and/or cancellation of the party.
 - This section does not apply to any clubhouse rentals and or member only parties/events.
- 2) Picnic tables are limited to one per member family, this applies at all times.
- 3) Any private parties/events, non-member guests cannot exceed 20 guests.
- 4) The Club reserves the right to deny any private parties/events based on scheduled Club events, clubhouse rentals and other reserved parties the same day. Private party/event permits will be issued on first come first serve basis and at no time will exceed three private parties per day per property.
- Members are responsible for all their non-member guests and their adherence to Club rules at any private party/event.
- 6) Pop up(EZ up) tents are limited to one per party not to exceed 10x10 within the beach/picnic areas and 20x20 within the dock/grass area at first beach. This applies to member only, club events and private parties.
- 7) Set up of private and/or member only parties/events should not occur before 6am the day of the party/event. This includes the reserving of picnic tables for any purpose.
- 8) The Club requires wrist bands be worn by all non-member guests at any private parties/events which will be provided by the Club.
- 9) Any member who wishes to enter into any rental agreement for party rental equipment, inflatable's or any other equipment to be used on Club property that may require an insurance liability waiver must contact the Club for approval prior to signing of any contracts.
- 10) The rights of Club members and common courtesy, including but not limited to the use of any music, should be paramount when hosting private parties and events on Club property.

BEACH RULES

Current I.D. badges must be displayed while on all Club properties.

There is a 10 PM curfew on all Club properties.

Swim at your own risk when lifeguards are not on duty or not present.

Pets are not allowed on first or third beach properties from Memorial Day to Labor Day while other members are present. Owners are responsible for cleanup of their pets at all times. *Dog owners are responsible to control their dogs at all times when utilizing all Club properties.*

Children on Club properties under the age of 12, must be directly supervised by a parent or other responsible person who is at least 14 years old.

Unprotected glass containers are prohibited on beach properties. Glass containers when utilized must be in a protective or insulating container to prevent breakage.

Bicycles or motorized vehicles are not permitted on the beaches.

All trash and personal possessions must be removed from Club properties daily.

No sitting or hanging on the swim ropes or swim lanes.

When guards are on duty, swimmers are not permitted to go outside the designated swim area. The swim area shall be determined by the lifeguards.

No rough play, pushing or shoving.

No swimming under the rafts or docks.

One person at a time on any ladders.

Smoking of tobacco products including e-cigarettes is prohibited on Club properties as follows:

- 1) First Beach property inclusive of the beach, playground, picnic, and swim dock area,
- 2) Second Beach inclusive of the entire upper level playground/basketball area.



The authority of the lifeguards and security persons shall be respected. The lifeguards have the right to remove anyone from the property for not following the rules or acting in an unsafe or disrespectful manner.
