#### Summary of the Lake Shawnee Club Board Meetings

#### September 9, 2022

The Social Committee reported that all the summer events were well attended and very successful including the End of Summer Celebration. Upcoming events are the annual Dog Walk/Pet Parade in September and a Fall Movie Night in October. The deadline to RSVP for the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary is October 15<sup>th</sup>.

Solitude completed a survey of the lake on September 9<sup>th</sup> - although the lake was down almost a foot due to the lack of rain, it was in great shape. \*\*See more information on the lake and the treatment in the November/December ASK JEFF article.

We survived the lifeguard shortage this season although 3<sup>rd</sup> Beach was not manned very often. And Mr. Matt Matrisciano handled Summer Security very well this year.

It was reported that there is a tournament on September 10<sup>th</sup>.

The Swim Team won the leagues' Sportsmanship Award for the 4<sup>th</sup> year in a row.

A memorial bench will be installed at the Clubhouse by the horseshoe pits in honor of Mr. Warren Fisher.

It was reported that work on the new wall at Second Beach has been completed thanks to Gerry and Cathy Fahy. They donated their time and supplies to complete the stairs and their time to complete the wall (the supplies were purchased by the Club). An outside railing is planned which will be more durable and easier to replace or repair than the previous one down the middle. Blacktop resealing and repainting of the basketball lines will be completed in October. The Board discussed future plans for the area.



Treatment update - On Sept. 9<sup>th</sup>, we had our last survey and treatment by Solitude. Our chemistry - DO (7), PH (97.5), and Water Clarity (5 feet) were all looking great. Our filamentous algae treatment went very well on our last treatment with some amounts in a cove near North End. We did treat for a handful of lily pads (leaving the large patch alone) which have started to spread. We try to keep that large group of pads for fishermen. It provides cover and protection for small fish and attracts larger fish to feed on them. Most fisherman say this is a great place to catch fish.

We did find about 10 patches of tape grass with the stem and flower emerging at the surface. The plant itself was still close to the bottom and will soon dissipate as the water starts to chill down in these next few weeks. The flowering stems have already started to brown out. It was recommended by the biologist who has been treating our lake for 20 years to leave it to the Spring. With a good freeze this winter, some of it will die off naturally. We will watch this very closely next May and June as we start a new season.

While out on our survey, we saw something that was very beneficial to our lake - Freshwater Jellyfish. According to the biologist, this species of jelly fish only can live in very clean water. They were about the size of a penny and obviously translucent, so not easy to recognize. Again, another indicator that Lake Shawnee is one of the cleanest bodies of water of all the lakes in the area. Combined with the tiny, microscopic colonizing algae that looks like a brain (Bryozoa), we are in great shape. I applaud all lake-front homeowners and all members for being conscientious about what you do with your lawns and being careful about things going into the catch basins that could harm the lake. As the saying goes, "it takes a village", and I thank you.

With that being said, a final reminder as those leaves start to fall (which is a lot sooner with the dry weather), please keep them out of the lake and away from catch basins. They lead to eutrophication (sediment building up on the bottom of the lake). Try and get those leaves off your lawn before they blow into the lake naturally.

One last thing which is not lake related. Monarch butterflies are in trouble. Their habitat, which mostly consists of milkweed plants, has been destroyed by spraying and cutting roadside vegetation. The monarchs lay their eggs on these milkweed plants so the caterpillars can eat the leaves before they change into a beautiful butterfly. Needless to say, there has been an effort by many to plant milkweed seeds to increase this very valuable plant for monarchs. I am always searching for the plants to gather their pods that contains the seeds. Thanks to Jim Beyel, a good friend and neighbor, I found my milkweed plants and their seed-laden pods. I have picked about 20 pods. If you would like a pod so you can be part of the effort to help monarchs, give me a call. Thank you in advance.

That's it for now folks. Enjoy the beautiful colors this fall. As always, any questions about the lake don't hesitate to call or email me.



#### Message from the Mayor

So, I realize all just received our recent Township newsletter in which I mentioned the town was hoping to pave the remaining side roads in the lake and West Shawnee in the Spring. Lousy timing, unfortunately. I always try to be optimistic, and I wrote that message at the beginning of October. Our public works crew has been working and trying hard to get all the side road drainage done, but as of 10/25, they are just finishing up on Mountain View. After consulting with my Engineering and Public Works professionals, we decided not to push it and hold off on all paving until Spring. Weather and colder night temperatures and, believe it or not, all the leaves coming down really make it unfavorable to pave. Most paving companies begin to shut down beginning in November as it becomes unfavorable to get this work done. We were looking at almost a week of milling and a week of paving and hoping we would have favorable conditions to complete it all, which could be a gamble. If the actual road temperatures are not above 50 degrees, we cannot pave. We want a quality product that lasts when it is done, so doing so in the Spring, combined with paving West Shawnee simultaneously, is the best choice.

Last, be aware once our public works crew finishes up on Mountain View, they will be going right over to West Shawnee to complete the drainage project from Mallard to almost Second Beach.

#### Ice Safety

Outdoor ice sports and activities can be safe and enjoyable, but there is no such thing as 100 percent safe ice. Anyone who spends time near the ice should first determine the ice conditions, and then take precautions to stay safe.

#### **Preventing Ice Accidents**

- Follow these guidelines to avoid accidents when on or near ice:
- Check the ice thickness before going out. To be safe, ice should be solid and at least 4 inches thick. Remember, the ice may not be the same thickness over the entire area of a lake or pond. Test ice thickness by using a chisel, cordless drill or ice auger.
- Be safe—the more people on the ice, the thicker it should be.
- Use ice on smaller, shallower and slower-moving bodies of water for ice activities, it is usually more solid.
- Look for objects sticking up through the ice and mark them as hazards.
- Do not go out on ice that has recently frozen, thawed and then frozen again. This happens in the spring and early winter as temperatures change often. Wait until the outside temperature has been below freezing long enough that at least 4 inches of solid ice forms over the entire area.
- Always stay with at least one other person.

### LAKE SHAWNEE ICE FISHING RULES

- No use of gas-powered augers before 8 AM
- No fishing closer than 50 feet from the shore of anyone's property unless it is your own
- No fishing closer than 100 feet from the Beach areas and directly behind the Clubhouse
- Drill no more than ten holes per person per day
- Return all fish to the Lake alive that you do not intend to eat or otherwise take with you
- When leaving, take everything off the ice with you, including fish, garbage, coals, firewood, cans, etc.
- No glass bottles allowed on the ice at any time
- No fires allowed on the ice other than cooking on a grill
- Member or guest badges must be worn while on the ice

# These rules must be followed in order for all of us to continue enjoying our ice fishing on Lake Shawnee!
